Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

SBIRT is a comprehensive, integrated, public health approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment services for persons with substance use disorders, as well as those who are at risk of developing these disorders. Primary care centers, hospital emergency rooms, trauma centers, and other community settings provide opportunities for early intervention with at-risk substance users before more severe consequences occur.

- Screening quickly assesses the severity of substance use and identifies the appropriate level of treatment.
- Brief intervention focuses on increasing insight and awareness regarding substance use and motivation toward behavioral change.
- Referral to treatment provides those identified as needing more extensive treatment with access to specialty care.

Alcohol and Drugs

<u>Physician Positive Alcohol Screen Case</u>: Three questions from InSight that will assist before administering a screening tool.

<u>CAGE-AID Purpose</u>: This document explains the purpose & evidence regarding CAGE-AID and why providers should use this document. (alcohol & drugs)

<u>CAGE-AID form</u>: This provides a quick overview and the 4 question document that providers can use. (Alcohol and drugs)

<u>CAGE-AID scoring</u>: This document explains how to score the CAGE-AID screen.

<u>UNCOPE Scoring Tool</u>: The UNCOPE can be used in a variety of settings and is not intended to be an intake tool. Screen are most appropriate for identifying risk for abuse or dependence. Score of 2 or more indicate any abuse OR dependence. Score of 4 or more indicate dependence

<u>UNCOPE Plus screening tool</u>: This is only a draft to suggest a model and is not intended to represent the scoring or recommendation criteria to be adopted. Those wishing to provide feedback on the UNCOPE-Plus findings are advised to collect data to validate the appropriateness

<u>UNCOPE screening tool</u>: The UNCOPE consists of six questions that may provide a simple and quick means of identifying risk for abuse and dependence for alcohol and other drugs.

Marijuana

Cannabis Use Disorder Identification Test Score: Here is the tool to score the CUDIT-R

Pregnancy

<u>The 5Ps Prenatal Substance Abuse Screen For Alcohol and Drugs</u>: This tool should be used with pregnant women who may use alcohol or drugs. These are non-confrontational questions.

Co-Occurring Disorders (Mental Health/Trauma/Substance Use)

AC-OK (Co-Occurring Screening tool): This 7 page packet describes this 5 minute (15 question) Screen for Co-Occurring Disorders and is a rapid-response screen instrument designed to identify the co-existing disorders of mental health and trauma related mental health issues and substance abuse
