The goal is to help highly motivated individuals get through recovery cravings until they have stabilized their lives.

MyCare accepts a wide variety of insurances.

No one will be denied services due to an inability to pay. Financial assistance is available based on family size and income through a Sliding Fee Scale Program.




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Opioid and Alcohol Medication Assisted Treatment Program





Opioid addiction is a serious and common problem in our community.

Addiction can be devastating, both psychologically and physically.

An alternative treatment for addiction is called

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT).

MAT combines the use of medication and behavioral therapy to treat people who have a substance use disorder, such as opioids and/or alcohol, regain optimal functioning and healthy living. Therapy can help work through the psychological aspects of dependence, while medication can help address the physical changes in the brain and lessen cravings, providing the addicted individual the chance to focus on their recovery.

Counseling and a strong support network are essential to helping people to stay in recovery.

The ultimate goal of MAT is full recovery, including the ability to live a self-directed life. Addiction cannot be cured, but can be managed.

Most people cannot recover alone.



MyCare currently prescribes Vivitrol® (Naltrexone) as part of MAT, which is the only, non-addictive, once-a-month injectable medication that is a recovery tool used along with therapy to treat opioid and alcohol dependence.

Vivitrol® (Naltrexone) is a long acting prescription injectable medicine that:

- Prevents relapse to opioid dependence after opioid detox
 - Treats alcohol dependence
 - Helps reduce cravings
 - To be effective, Vivitrol® must be used along with therapy
 - Is non-narcotic; no abuse potential
- Does not cause withdrawal symptoms when stopped
