Step 1: Is Event a "Critical Incident?" (See above chart)

If no, Stop. If yes, go to Step 2.

Step 2: Was the incident an unexpected occurrence (not from natural causes)?

If no, Stop. If yes, go to Step 3.

- Step 3: Did the incident result in death or serious physical or psychological injury? (Serious injury is major permanent loss of limb or function as determined by a physician or registered nurse; psychological injury is impaired psychological functioning, growth, or development of a significant nature as evidenced by observable physical symptomatology, as determined by a mental health professional.) If no, go to Step 4. If yes, CLASSIFY AS SENTINEL EVENT
- Step 4: Was there risk of loss? (If the event had continued, loss, i.e., death or serious physical or psychological injury, would have occurred as determined by a physician or registered nurse.) If no, Stop.

If yes, CLASSIFY AS SENTINEL EVENT AND PERFORM ROOT CAUSE ANALYSIS
