Procedures for Involuntary Commitment if a Juvenile Presents a Suicide Risk

A parent can request an emergency evaluation if there is a reason to believe the minor is emotionally disturbed and poses a danger to themselves or others.

Petitions must contain the basis for the request, the names and addresses of all witnesses, and the name and address of the nearest relative or guardian.

Macomb County Community Mental Health's Children's Mobile Intensive Crisis Stabilization Services (ICSS)

The program provides in-home or community-based crisis intervention services to Macomb County children and families. A therapist and a parent support partner will respond to any non-life threatening emotional or behavioral issues that may be disrupting daily life.
