## Who to Call in a Crisis

During a crisis or emergency, there are several numbers you can call for help:

### **988: National Suicide & Crisis Lifeline:**

If you are experiencing suicidal thoughts or emotional distress, the 988 Suicide & Crisis Line is available by phone, text, or chat 24/7.

Support is free and confidential. Call or text **988** or visit **988lifeline.org**. When you call 988 from Macomb County, you will be connected with MCCMH staff.

## 911: Police, Fire, and Medical Emergency

You should call **911** if you require help from the police or fire departments, or if you need emergency medical assistance.

### Call 911 if:

- A person or group is in imminent danger
- A person is harming themselves or others
- A crime is in progress (or if you witness suspicious activity)
- There is an accident or fire

Text to 911 is now available. Call if you can or text if you can't.

## Mobile Crisis Services

Our Mobile Crisis services support children and adults in Macomb County facing a mental health crisis. The Mobile Crisis team can assist when someone is:

- Experiencing a mental health crisis or presenting behaviors that require professional intervention
- Struggling with thoughts of suicide and/or participating in self-harming behaviors
- About to physically injure themselves or others

To request the Mobile Crisis team, call **(586) 307-9100** and ask for a Mobile Crisis Therapist. They will assess the situation and determine the best way to help.

Services are available 24/7.



## Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM)

CISM is an intervention protocol designed to help those who have experienced trauma. If you're finding it difficult to cope after a crisis, CISM offers confidential support, connecting you with others who understand. Through these sessions, you can share your experiences, process your emotions, learn about stress reactions, and receive referrals for additional support.

## Support for Youth at Risk of Suicide

Parents and caregivers can request an emergency evaluation for children or teens at risk of harming themselves or others.

We also offer Mobile Intensive Crisis Stabilization Services (ICSS) to Macomb County children and families experiencing a non-life-threatening mental health crisis.

# Services for People Experiencing Homelessness

## **Angel's Wing | (586) 752-3661**

Transitional housing for one family with children. At least one member of the family must be working full time.

## **Amelia Agnes Home | (586) 323-7066**

Housing, transportation, employment skills training, and childcare for homeless women (at least 23 years of age) with children (ages 12 and under).

## **Family Youth Interventions – Transitional Living Program | (586) 477-1855**

Supervised congregate living for youths ages 16-20 who are experiencing homelessness.

## **Family Youth Interventions | (586) 465-1212**

Temporary shelter for runaway youths or youths (ages 12-17).

**Macomb's Answer to Temporary Shelter (MATTS) | (586) 755-5191**

Up to 90 days of shelter a year for single men, women, and families.

**The MCCMH Housing Program (586) 469-5100**

Available to those receiving support from MCCMH who are experiencing homelessness (or are at risk of becoming homeless).
