This training provides guidance for case managers and therapists in navigating the PCP process. It brings insight to recognizing when our elders need specialized care and how to properly refer and link to programs and specialists that can provide the needed services. This training includes ways for children and adolescents to interact and share knowledge and companionship that can be worked into their PCPs
