

Adult Mobile Crisis Services

On-site help for individuals in distress

We offer mobile crisis services to support adults in Macomb County experiencing a mental health crisis.

The mobile crisis team can assist when someone is:

- Going through a mental health crisis or presenting behaviors that require professional intervention
- Struggling with thoughts of suicide and/or participating in self-harming behaviors
- About to physically injure themselves or others

To reach the mobile crisis team, call the MCCMH Crisis Center at **586-307-9100** and ask for the mobile crisis therapist. They will assess the situation and determine the best way to help.

Mobile crisis services are available 24/7.

Our mobile crisis team includes a therapist and peer support specialist trained in intervention and de-escalation techniques.

After the crisis has been stabilized, we'll work with the person to create a safety plan and connect them with the services they need.
