A pathway to recovery

A Substance Use Disorder Health Home (SUDHH) is not a physical place, but a program to help you recover from substance use.

The SUDHH team will work with you to create a plan that fits your goals. This plan will not only address your substance use, but also support your physical health, mental well-being, and social needs.

Services may include:



Care coordination and management



Health promotion



Comprehensive transitional care



Individual and family support



Referral to community and social support services

You may be eligible for the SUDHH if:

- You are diagnosed with an opioid use disorder, alcohol use disorder, or stimulant use disorder
- You have Medicaid, Healthy Michigan Plan, Freedom to Work, or Healthy Kids Expansion

What are the benefits of SUDHH?

- All-inclusive care coordination
- Personalized plans for your specific concerns
- Transitional care assistance
- Health education and promotional resources
- Individual and family assistance
- Connections to community and support resources
- Access to a team of health care professionals
