Substance Use Engagement Center

The Substance Use Engagement Center is a short-term crisis intervention facility that provides a supervised, supportive setting for individuals with substance use disorders. Individuals are provided with a safe place to have a meal, take a shower, and talk to caring staff. Services are typically provided by Peer Recovery Coaches.

The MCCMH Engagement Center is available 24/7 for Macomb County residents who are actively using substances or are under the influence.

Substance Use Disorder Services

Recovery is possible

Substance use disorders (SUD) affect people of all ages and walks of life. They are common, recurrent, and often serious. However, they are treatable, and there is hope for the future.

We offers substance use services for people who are uninsured and those with Medicaid or the Healthy Michigan Plan. Our providers are licensed and accredited. They offer a variety of SUD treatment services, including, but not limited to:

PREVENTION & EARLY INTERVENTION:

Services educate the community about the risks of substance use.

OUTPATIENT/INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT TREATMENT(IOP): Clinical services are provided in a structured setting and include individual and group therapy, assessments, and referrals to other necessary services.





MEDICATION ASSISTED TREATMENT:

A licensed physician prescribes medications to treat opioid use disorder while the individual receives outpatient treatment.

SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER HEALTH HOMES (SUDHH): Comprehensive care management and coordination services for Medicaid recipients with an alcohol use disorder, stimulant use disorder, or opioid use disorder in an outpatient setting.

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT: Substance use treatment services are provided in a residential setting, including individual and group therapy, life skills training, and educational sessions, with staff available on-site 24 hours a day.

WITHDRAWAL MANAGEMENT: Clinically and medically managed care in a 24-hour, supervised setting to address the physical effects of substance use withdrawal.

OTHER RECOVERY SUPPORT FOR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER:

- Recovery Community Centers:
 Provides a variety of recovery-oriented meetings, activities, and support.
- Peer Recovery Support: Those with lived experience help others navigate treatment.
- Recovery Home Services: Substancefree housing available for people actively engaged in treatment and working to maintain recovery.

Women's Specialty Services

Women's Specialty Services provide support for women who are pregnant or parenting and need help with substance use. These services are designed to address all the physical and behavioral health needs of both the women in treatment and her child(ren).

In Michigan, pregnant women and mothers with custody of their children are given priority when it comes to getting into treatment programs. Parents involved with Children's Protective Services, or whose children are in foster care or living with relatives, can also receive services.



What do Women's Specialty Services programs offer?

These services provide or arrange for:

- Primary medical care for women (in cluding prenatal care)
- Primary pediatric care for dependent children, including immunizations
- Substance use treatment and therapy programs designed specifically for women, which may also address important issues like relationships, parenting, and experiences of sexual or physical abuse.
- Therapy and support services for children in the care of women receiving treatment, which may focus on their development and help address experiences of abuse, neglect, or trauma.
- Case management and transportation services.
- Childcare so women can attend treatment services.
