Medicines that Can Cause You to Test Positive for Opiates

Prescription and over-the-counter medicines for cough and cold, with decongestants

- Advil PM
- Dextromethorphan
- Hydrocodone

Prescription medicines for mental health conditions

- Quetiapine (Seroquel)
- Chlopromazine
- Naltrexone
- Risperidone
- Trazadone
- Labetalol

Prescription and over-the-counter medicines for asthma and allergies

- Benadryl
- Diphenhydramine

Prescription medicines used for bacterial infections.

- Ofloxacin (Floxin, Ocuflox)
- Levofloxacin
- Pefloxacin

Other substances

Poppy seeds

It is possible that other medicines not on this list may cause a urine drug test to be positive for opiates.
