



# Habilitation Support Waiver (HSW/HAB)

## Support services for people with disabilities

The Habilitation Support Waiver (HSW/HAB) helps people with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD). It provides services to support them in living on their own and being part of the community. This program is funded by the government and needs to be renewed every year to ensure the person meets the requirements.

### To qualify yearly for the HSW/HAB, a person must:

- Have an I/DD diagnosis
- Receive one or more of the following services:
  - Community Living Supports (CLS)
  - Out of Home Non-Vocational Habilitation
  - Pre-Vocational Services
  - Supported Employment
- Live in a community setting
- Be eligible and enrolled in Medicaid
- Need help learning basic skills to be more independent and participate in the community

The HSW/HAB helps maximize Medicaid funding options to meet the needs of those with I/DDs. The waiver ensures services are provided to the person with an I/DD who cannot live in the community independently.

## Services include:

- Enhanced medical equipment and supplies
- Enhanced pharmacy
- Environmental modifications
- Family and non-family training
- Fiscal intermediary
- Goods and services (S-D Only)
- Overnight health and safety support
- Personal emergency response system
- Private duty nursing (for those 21 years old or older)
- Respite care
