

Cultural Humility in Behavioral Healthcare

Presented by Melvin Lunkins

This training explores the role of cultural humility in behavioral health practices and their impact on communication, client engagement, treatment planning, and professional relationships. Participants will examine how assumptions, communication styles, intent versus impact, and power dynamics can influence interactions with clients. The training emphasizes practical strategies for asking respectful questions, avoiding assumptions, using person centered and trauma responsive language, and strengthening therapeutic relationships.

Through discussion, case studies, and real-world examples, participants will develop skills to support culturally responsive, person-centered care. Special attention is given to communication practices that promote trust, psychological safety, accurate documentation, and alignment with MDHHS expectations for person centered planning and Individual Plans of Service (IPOS).
