I. Abstract

This policy establishes standards and procedures for an internal records alert system for information regarding known or suspected consumer drug allergies that may affect considerations for treatment and care of the individual by the Macomb County Community Mental Health (MCCMH) provider network.

II. Application

This policy shall apply to all directly-operated and contract network providers of the MCCMH Board.

III. Policy

It is the policy of the MCCMH Board that information regarding known drug allergies be ascertained from each consumer and his/her health care providers and noticed conspicuously on the cover of the consumer's clinical record for consideration in the provision of service by the MCCMH provider network.

IV. Definitions

A. Drug Allergy

-- an acquired hypersensitivity to a drug (allergen) that does not normally cause a reaction, and is usually manifested as skin eruption, edema, fever, and/or anaphylactoid reaction.

V. Standards

- A. MCCMH directly-operated and contract network providers shall ascertain pertinent information from the consumer and his/her health care providers regarding consumer drug allergies.
- B. Pertinent information regarding drug allergies shall be noted in the consumer's clinical record and shall be visibly noted on a medical alert label (Exhibit A) on the cover of the consumer's clinical record or in the consumer's electronic medical record.

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VI. Procedures

- A. When a drug allergy diagnosis becomes known at intake or during the course of treatment, the pertinent information shall be noted in and on the consumer's clinical record by the nurse or physician overseeing the consumer's treatment.
- B. The cover notations shall be made by completing the appropriate colored medical alert label (Exhibit A) and affixing it to the outside front cover of the clinical record.
